Scholarship Opportunities

- **Power of You Scholarship (Deadline April 26, 2019):** The Power of You (POY) program makes your dream of attending college tuition-free a possibility. To be eligible, students must
 - graduate in the spring 2019 with plans to enroll in fall 2019
 - complete the FAFSA
 - Modest family income (annual income not exceeding \$55,000)
 - Score above Adult Basic Education (ABE) on the **required** Accuplacer assessments in reading and math
 - Plan to enroll in Minneapolis Community & Tech College or Saint Paul College

- **ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN CONTRACTORS SCHOLARSHIP (Deadline April 30, 2019):**
 - For High School and Apprentice Women Pursuing Education In The Trades
 - Female students currently enrolled in construction-related fields at a four-year college; two-year community or technical college, or a construction trade school.
 - You must also be a current resident of Minnesota or attending postsecondary education.

- **Minneapolis Rotary Club Scholarships (Deadline May 1, 2018):** Since 1991, the Minneapolis Rotary Club, one of 34,000 Rotary clubs worldwide, has helped graduates from Minneapolis Public High Schools attend college. The Minneapolis Rotary Scholarship is awarded each year to exceptional graduating students chosen from the Minneapolis Public High Schools. **NOTE:** [the application](#) must be completed in 1 session. Students are strongly encouraged to compose the scholarship in a Word or Google doc first, and then copy and paste it into the application. [One letter of recommendation is required \(2 max accepted\); transcript must also be uploaded.](#)
 - **John & Lynn Goodwyne Scholarship** (\$1,350 per year for 4 years) - Minneapolis High School Senior who is seeking a degree in science, engineering or math.
 - **Friswold Family Scholarship** (\$1,350 per year for 4 years) - Minneapolis high school senior who has demonstrated academic achievement and significant community service.
 - **Franklin D. Gray Scholarship** (\$1,125 per year for 4 years) - Minneapolis high school senior who has demonstrated academic achievement and significant community service.
 - **Clint & Carolyn Schroeder Scholarship** (\$1,125 per year for 4 years) - Minneapolis high school senior who has demonstrated academic achievement and significant community service.
 - **Rotary Scholarship/Anonymous Donor** (\$1,125 per year for 4 years) - Minneapolis high school senior who has demonstrated academic achievement and significant community service.
 - **The Alan A. Grove, Christopher A. Grove and Patrick T. Grove Scholarship** (\$1,350 per year for 4 years) - A student attending St. John's University in Collegeville, Minnesota; College of St. Benedict in St. Joseph, Minnesota or the University of Nebraska-Lincoln
- **DUNWOODY College of Technology--Women In Technical Careers (WITC):**
 - \$20,000 Scholarship benefits include:
 - A scholarship of up to \$10,000/year to augment your financial aid package.

 - Have completed high school (or earned a high school equivalency credential)

 - Exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a career or technical program (up to 2 years) at an accredited non-profit post-secondary institution in the United States
 - Demonstrated critical financial need (must be eligible to receive the Federal Pell grant as determined by completion of the FAFSA)
 - Demonstrated perseverance in overcoming adversity
 - Be under the age of 30
 - Be a United States citizen

Financial Aid Information

- **FAFSA**--Look for emails/letters from your institutions or log in to your FAFSA account to confirm it has processed. Sometimes students are selected for verification; this would be noted on your SAR (Student Aid Report) or via email/letter from your institution. Verification is “the process your school uses to confirm that the data reported on your FAFSA form is accurate. If you’re selected for verification, your school will request additional documentation that supports the information you reported. Don’t assume you’re being accused of doing anything wrong. Some people are selected for verification at random; and some schools verify all students' FAFSA forms. All you need to do is provide the documentation your school asks for—and be sure to do so by the school’s deadline, or you won’t be able to get financial aid.” (source: <https://studentaid.ed.gov/>)

- **Selective Service System** – Male U.S. citizens and immigrants, documented and undocumented, residing in the U.S. and its territories must register if they are age 18 through 25. Registration is the process by which the U.S. Government collects names and addresses of men age 18 through 25 to use in case of a national emergency, determined by Congress and the President, which would require rapid expansion of the Armed Forces. This process can be completed while applying for the FAFSA. www.sss.gov

- **MN Dream Act** – State Financial Aid – Students who meet the criteria in the MN Dream Act will be eligible for in-state resident tuition rates at public colleges and universities, state financial aid available to students who meet state residency requirements, and privately funded financial aid through public colleges and universities. www.ohs.state.mn.us/MNDreamAct
