Scholarship Opportunities

- **Wallin Education Partners Scholarship (Deadline extended: to Wed, Feb 20 @ 11:59 PM):** Receive up to \$4000/year for up to 4 years; work with a professional advisor throughout college, and have access to college-to-career opportunities through Wallin EP sponsored events and activities. Eligible students are those with the following. More information at <https://wallinpartners.org/apply/>
 - minimum 3.0 GPA
 - minimum 19 ACT composite
 - completed FAFSA
 - Have applied and intend to attend a private or public not-for-profit four-year institution in MN, IA, SD, ND, or WI or any Historically Black College or University in the Nation immediately after high school (no gap year)
 - Have a family taxable income of \$75,000 or less, low-to-moderate assets, and have financial need with regard to financial aid
- **Wallin Education Partners Opportunities Pathways (Deadline March 15, 2019):** Receive up to \$4000/year for up to 4 years; work with a professional advisor throughout college, and have access to college-to-career opportunities through Wallin EP sponsored events and activities.  - completed FAFSA
 - Participated in AchieveMpls Career & College Planning or Genesys Works
 - Plan to attend community college full-time at one of the partner community colleges starting Fall 2019:

 - St. Paul College
 - Plan to study and pursue a career in one of the following fields:
 - Information Technology
 - Business Management
 - Health Care
 - Manufacturing/Engineering Technology
 - Have a family taxable income of \$75,000 or less, low-to-moderate assets, and have financial need with regard to financial aid
- **Power of You Scholarship (Deadline April 26, 2019):** The Power of You (POY) program makes your dream of attending college tuition-free a possibility. To be eligible, students must
 - graduate in the spring 2019 with plans to enroll in fall 2019
 - complete the FAFSA
 - Modest family income (annual income not exceeding \$55,000)
 - Score above Adult Basic Education (ABE) on the **required** Accuplacer assessments in reading and math
 - Plan to enroll in Minneapolis Community & Tech College or Saint Paul College
- **SW General Scholarship (Deadline March 15, 2019):** One application for numerous scholarships. App can be found on student's Naviance account under "about me → surveys." More info to come!

Financial Aid Information

- **FAFSA**--Look for emails/letters from your institutions or log in to your FAFSA account to confirm it has processed. Sometimes students are selected for verification; this would be noted on your SAR (Student Aid Report) or via email/letter from your institution. Verification is “the process your school uses to confirm that the data reported on your FAFSA form is accurate. If you’re selected for verification, your school will request additional documentation that supports the information you reported. Don’t assume you’re being accused of doing anything wrong. Some people are selected for verification at random; and some schools verify all students' FAFSA forms. All you need to do is provide the documentation your school asks for—and be sure to do so by the school’s deadline, or you won’t be able to get financial aid.” (source: <https://studentaid.ed.gov/>)
- **Selective Service System** – Male U.S. citizens and immigrants, documented and undocumented, residing in the U.S. and its territories must register if they are age 18 through 25. Registration is the process by which the U.S. Government collects names and addresses of men age 18 through 25 to use in case of a national emergency, determined by Congress and the President, which would require rapid expansion of the Armed Forces. This process can be completed while applying for the FAFSA. www.sss.gov
- **MN Dream Act** – State Financial Aid – Students who meet the criteria in the MN Dream Act will be eligible for in-state resident tuition rates at public colleges and universities, state financial aid available to students who meet state residency requirements, and privately funded financial aid through public colleges and universities. www.ohe.state.mn.us/MNDreamAct
